- Conduct wildlife surveys, habitat evaluations, and/or general plant surveys.
- Conduct wildlife and/or special-status plant surveys and protocol-level surveys.
- Conduct wetland delineations.
- Conduct construction monitoring.
- Prepare a variety of environmental compliance documents such as Biological Study Reports, Biological Assessments, Aquatic Resource Delineation Reports, and Natural Environment Study reports, and assist with NEPA/CEQA documentation.
- Serve as liaison between various regulatory agencies and clients for environmental permit acquisition and compliance.
- Team with project engineers, site designers, and other specialists engaged in private and public projects.
- Coordinate or assist in the coordination of ENPLAN team member actions.
- Assist with the preparing of permits (e.g., Section 404, Section 401, CDFW Section 1600 LSA).
